

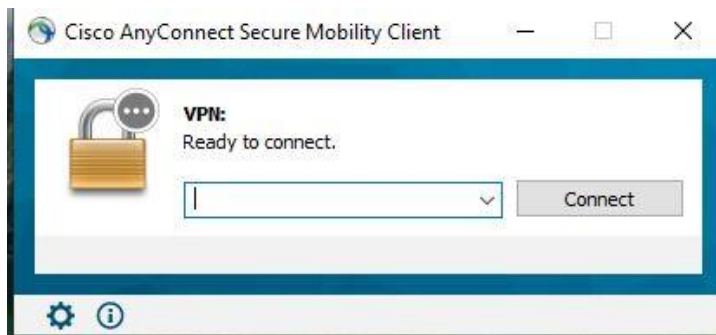
Installing and using the UF VPN

Remember, you must be on the UF VPN or the proxy server to use any of the Libraries' resources from off campus. This includes accessing Course Reserves, databases, e-Journals, e-Books, journal articles, newspapers, streaming video, and more.

To download and install the VPN for your operating system, see the instructions on [this page](#) from UF IT.

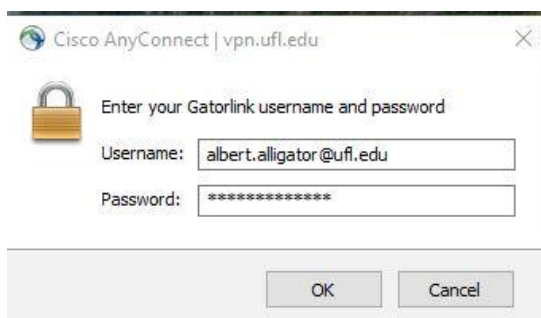
Once you have installed the files, find and open the Cisco AnyConnect software on your device. The Cisco software is what runs the VPN.

The first time you open the VPN, you'll see a box that will look like this:



In the box, type in **vpn.ufl.edu** and then click **Connect**. (Note: you only have to do this step the very first time you open the VPN. After you've done this, the software will just ask you for your Gatorlink).

After you click Connect, a new box will appear. Type in your Gatorlink information—make sure you enter in your full email address, including the @ufl.edu:



And click OK.

You will then need to do your 2 factor authentication (usually the Duo app on your phone, or whatever device you chose to have as your 2 factor authentication device).

Once you have completed the 2 factor authentication, you will now be connected to the VPN and can access the Libraries' databases, Course Reserves, journals, ebooks, and more.

When you are finished using the library, please sign off the VPN. When you need to use the library again, just sign back into the VPN—all you'll need is your Gatorlink and your 2 factor authentication.
